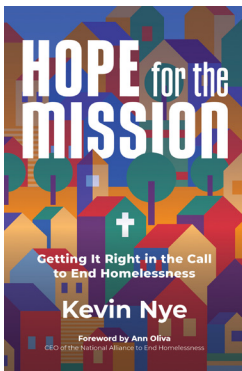


## Report to Indiana-Michigan Mennonite Conference

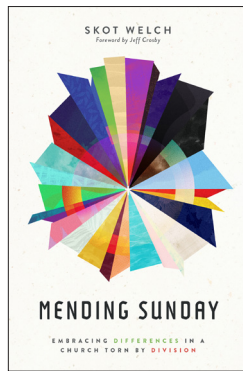


#### Hope for the Mission

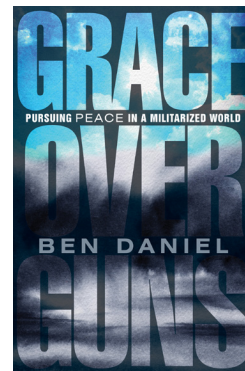

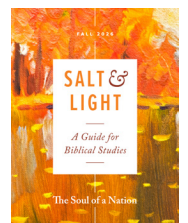
